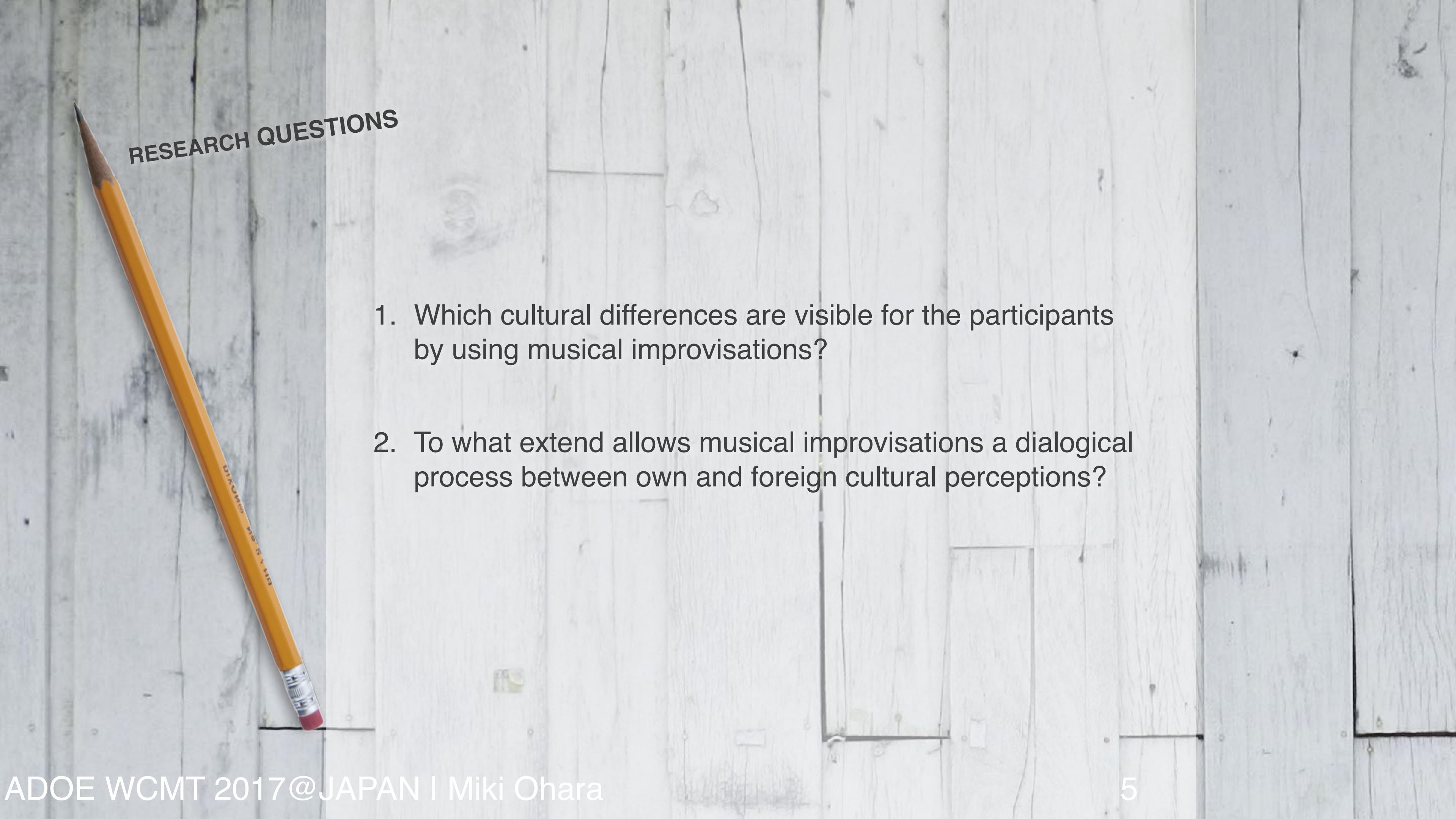

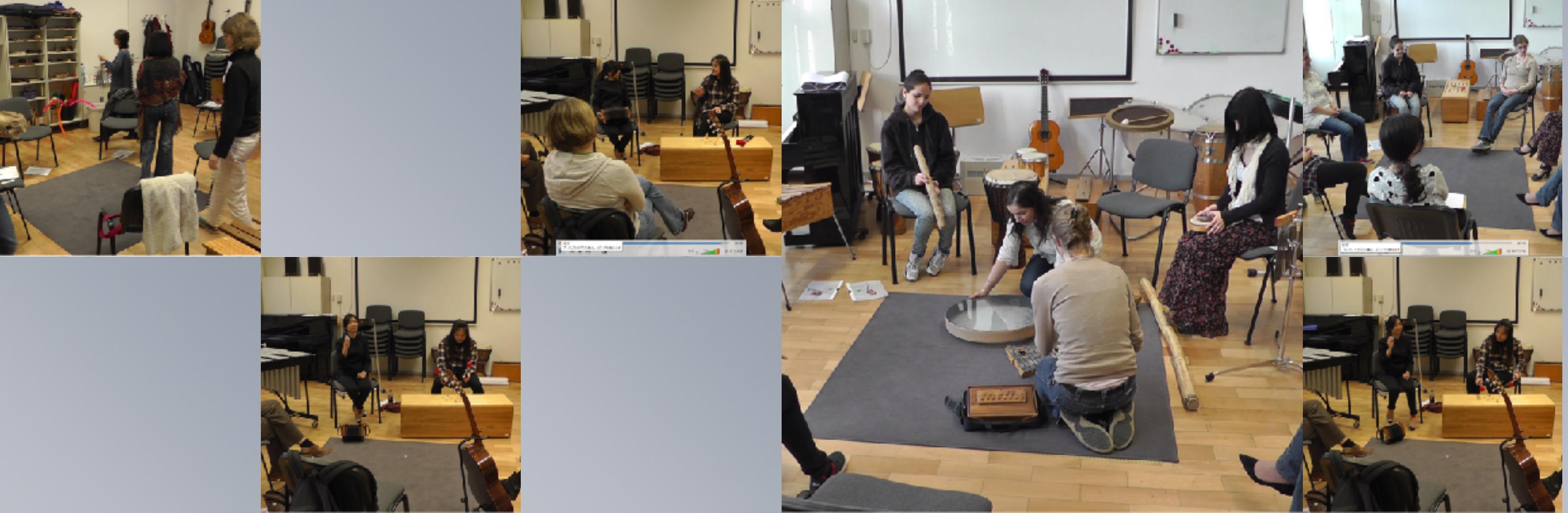


It has been analysed to what extend Japanese who are living for many years in Germany can be motivated for a better perception and reflexion of their experiences of strangerhood. However the main issue is not only a one-sided view on the Japanese but is also related in a broader context namely how an intercultural dialogue can be stimulated due to music therapeutic methods.

2. To what extend allows musical improvisations a dialogical process between own and foreign cultural perceptions?

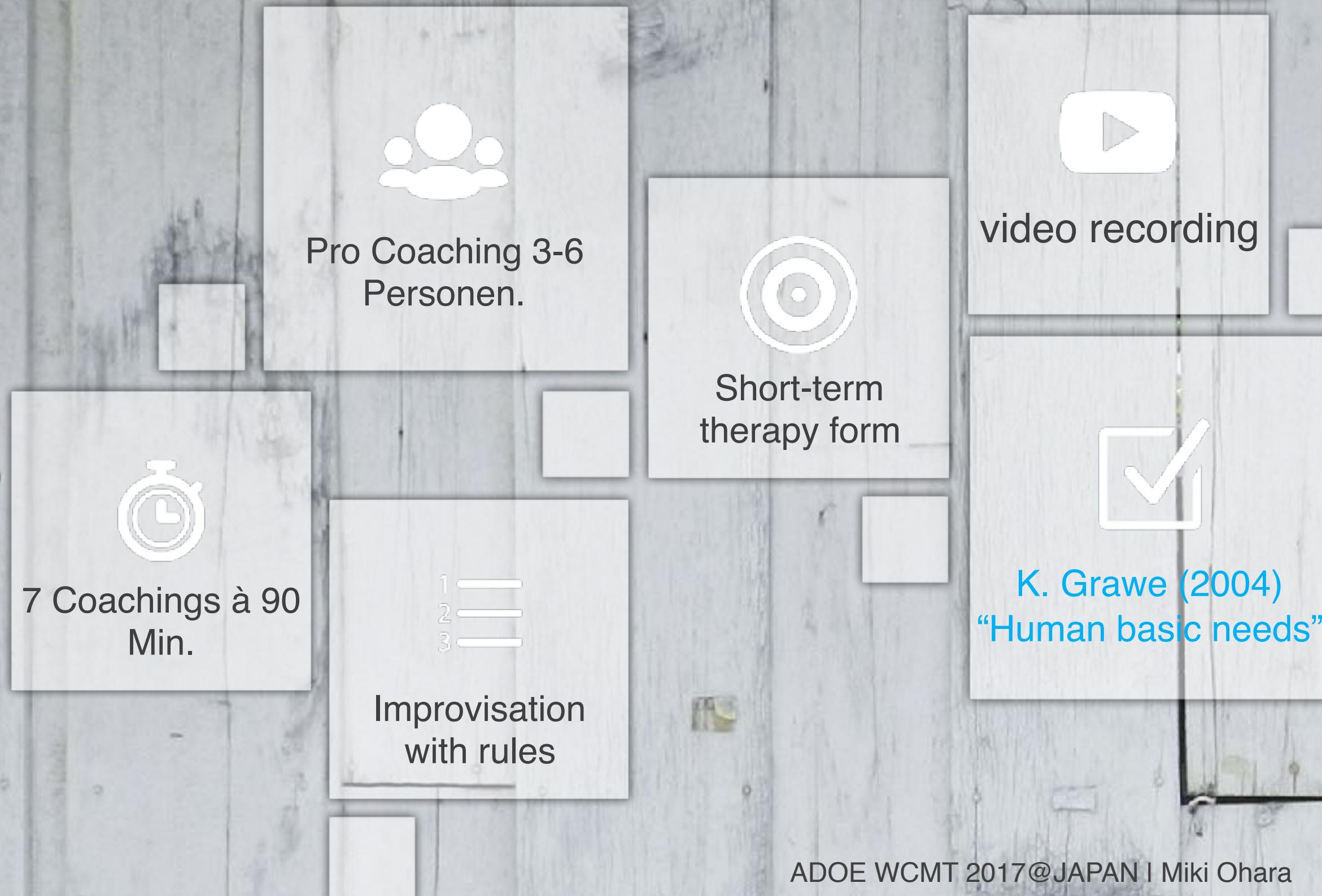

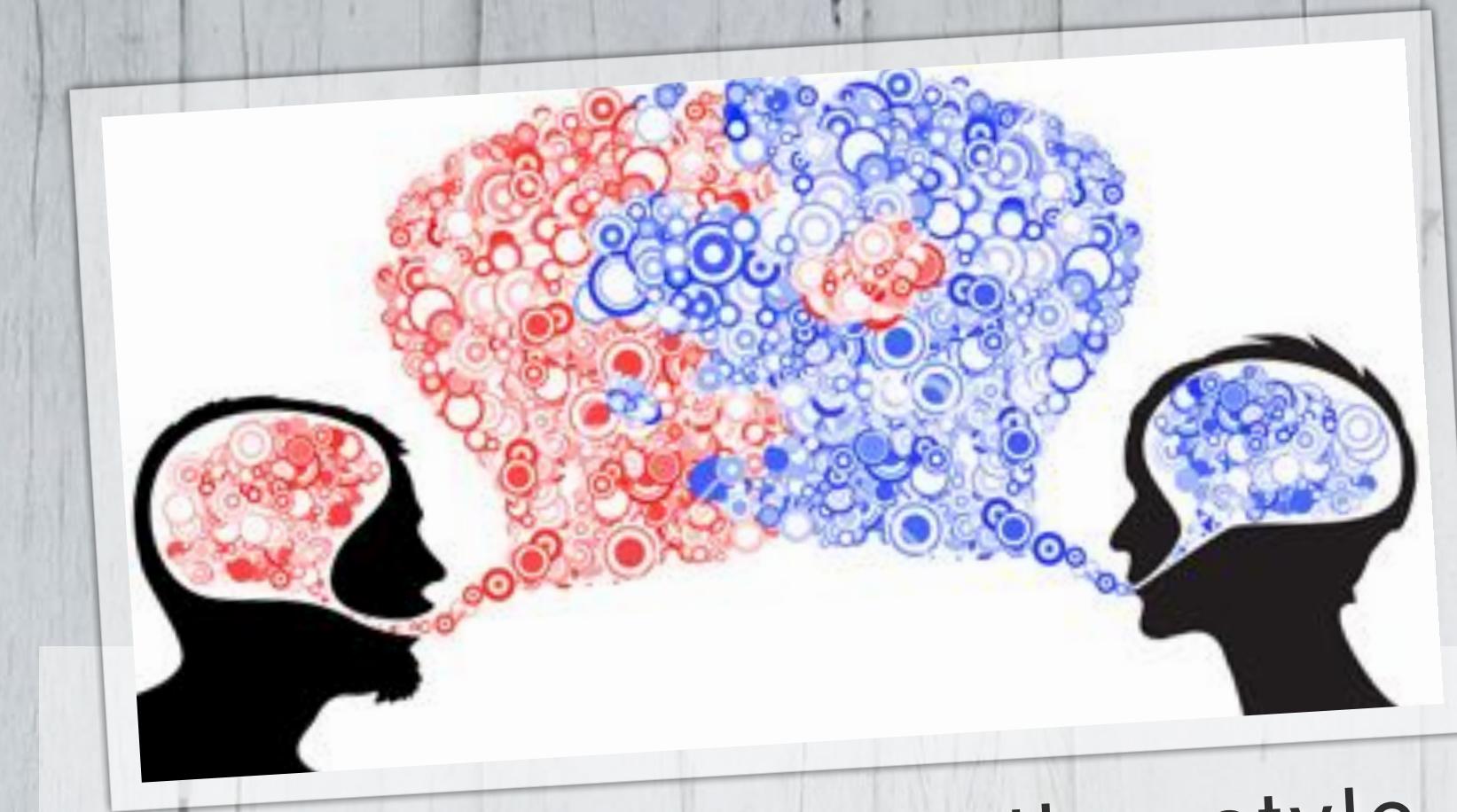

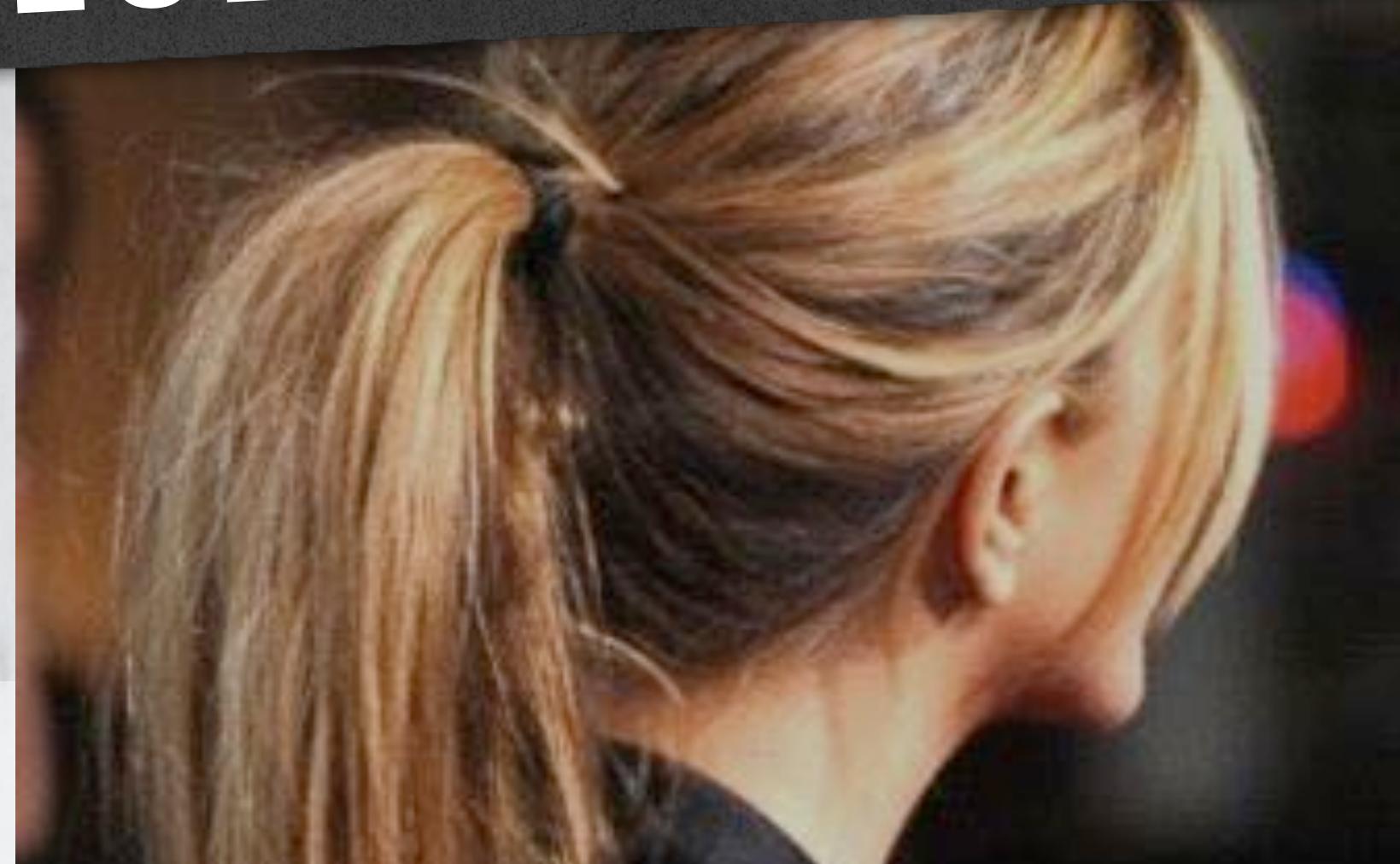


Immigrants have different acculturation problem.
